MA in Modern Greek Studies: Sociolinguistics

This new Master's programme is offered for the first time for registration in September 2009 (for one year full-time, or two years part-time study). It is the only programme in the UK that provides specialist teaching in the field of Modern Greek Sociolinguistics within a one-year format.

The programme is discipline-based and draws on a wide range of socio-cultural approaches to language (eg sociolinguistics, linguistic anthropology, discourse analysis) for the study and analysis of Modern Greek language, text and discourse in a variety of contemporary settings: everyday interaction, popular culture, new and mass media, education and the workplace.

All students on the MA Modern Greek Studies: Sociolinguistics programme will be affiliated to the LDC, which organises regular series of seminars, public lectures, data sessions and two annual research days. Content of the programme (taught modules)

7AABMA14 Language, identity & culture (40 credits)

7AABMA15 Linguistic analysis of Modern Greek narrative (20 credits)

7AABMA16 Linguistic approaches to narrative analysis (20 credits)

7AABMA40 Dissertation (compulsory module) (60 credits)

Additional/alternative modules (up to maximum 80 credits) may be selected from any of the LDC-affiliated MA programmes in linguistics, subject to availability:

Entry requirements

An Upper Second degree from a UK university, OR a GPA of 7.5 from a university in Greece or Cyprus, OR a GPA of 3.3 from a university in the US or Australia, OR an equivalent qualification in: (Socio)Linguistics, Modern Languages, Modern Greek Studies and any other relevant humanities or social science subject. For all students, a competent working knowledge of Modern Greek is required. For students whose first language is not English, please see the current requirements of the School of Arts and Humanities.
