CALL FOR PAPERS

The Society for Modern Greek studies calls on graduate students (research or taught) from universities in the UK and abroad to participate in its annual Graduate Research Colloquium. The Colloquium is a student-led event that aims to bring together students currently undertaking research in any field of the Arts and Humanities and Social Sciences related to the Modern Greek world (1453 - present), to provide them with the opportunity to present their research, discuss their ideas with their peers but also with distinguished scholars, and gain important feedback on their work.

Proposals, including an abstract of 200 words maximum as well as a brief biographical note, should be emailed to Trisevgeni Bilia at trisevgeni.bilia@st-annes.ox.ac.uk no later than Saturday 15 April 2023. Please indicate your full name, degree title, and university affiliation in the body of the email.

Papers should be in English and should not exceed 20 minutes. Participants will be notified of the selection of their abstract by 25 April 2023.
