Call for Papers

The Society for Modern Greek studies calls on graduate students (research or taught) and early career scholars from universities in the UK and abroad to participate in its annual Graduate Research Colloquium. The one-day Colloquium is a student-led event that aspires to bring together early career scholars currently undertaking research related to Modern Greek world, and Cyprus (1453-present). We welcome applications from any field of the Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences. We particularly encourage applications, which emphasise the cross-national dynamics in the Southeastern Mediterranean. The Colloquium provides students with the opportunity to present their research, discuss their ideas with their peers, expand cross-disciplinary collaboration, and gain important feedback on their work by distinguished scholars.

Proposals

Proposals, including a title, an abstract of 300 words maximum, and a brief CV (2 pages maximum) should be emailed as one PDF document to Panagiotis Karagkounis (panagiotis.karagkounis@manchester.ac.uk) by **21 June 2024**. Please indicate your full name, degree title, and university affiliation in the proposal.

Successful applicants will be notified by 1 July.

The Society welcomes submissions from graduate students registered at universities outside the UK but can only refund travel expenses (up to £50) if they are payable to a UK bank account. Priority will be given to students registered at UK universities.
